Thank you for your interest in auditioning for this year's spring musical, *The Little Mermaid*. In this packet you will find, both actor and crew audition sheets, cast and crew rehearsal schedules, a measurement page for actors, and a synopsis with a character list. Actors are to prepare and memorize a 1-minute contemporary dramatic monologue as well as 16 bars of a song in the style of *The Little Mermaid*. You also need to bring in a CURRENT picture of yourself (headshot), as well as upload that picture on the online form. If you are able to get a copy of the script, I encourage you to read it prior to auditions. All Actors auditioning are required to be at the dance call. For the dance call, you will be required to wear clothing that you can move in. NO JEANS. Bring character shoes and ballet shoes/jazz shoes with you to the dance call. All Actors and Crew must bring all your forms signed with you to Auditions. **Actors will NOT be allowed to audition without the audition and measurement forms completed in full and signed by both student and parent**. Crew only needs to drop off the audition form signed and that is all.

Make sure all the information is read thoroughly. Remember to fill out and make sure both you and **YOUR PARENTS sign** the audition sheet **prior** to arriving at auditions. The audition sheet acts as a **contract** between you, your parents, and me agreeing to the rehearsal times and to the rules of the theatre. Those interested in crew only, fill out the crew sheet and have both **you and your parents sign**. These forms, along with your measurement sheet & picture (actors), will be turned in on the day of auditions.

#### **OVERVIEW**

**Scuttle (m/f)** A disheveled seagull and expert in human artifacts. Loudmouthed, optimistic, and a bit ignorant, despite his supposed expertise.

**Flotsam (m/f)** An eel and one of Ursula's lackeys. Oily and spineless, he will say anything you want or need to hear.

**Jetsam (m/f)** An eel and one of Ursula's lackeys. Oily and spineless, he will say anything you want or need to hear.

**Ursula (f)** The banished Sea Witch and sister of King Triton. Supposedly spurned at childhood, she will use whatever method necessary to steal the kingdom and claim it as her own. Malevolent, calculating, and deceptive.

# **Attendance Policy**

Excused absences are **ONLY** those listed on your conflict sheet. **Be very specific** about dates and times.

- 1) You are allowed **ONLY 2** *unexcused* absences. If you have 3, you will be *replaced*.
- 2) Rehearsals **begin** at 3:30, **not** 3:31. If you are not ready to begin at 3:30, you are tardy to rehearsal. 3 Tardies count as 1 unexcused absence.
- Rehearsal attire is MANDATORY (leggings, athletic shorts, t-shirts.) Jeans (even stretchy jeans and jean shorts) are **not** allowed. Cargo pants/shorts are not allowed. Skirts without shorts/leggings are not allowed. *If you fail to plan ahead and arrive in anything other than appropriate rehearsal attire,* it will count against you as 1 unexcused absence and you will be sent home. Do not come to us and say "see, I can move in this." NO. Just. No. (Crew can wear jeans. Closed toe shoes only.)
- Work schedules, doctor/dentist/orthodontist/eye appointments, and other non-emergency scheduling (if not already on the conflict sheet) need to be made around rehearsals.
- Electronics are not allowed during rehearsals except for homework. The privilege of using your electronics is only given after asking Mrs. Knipp if you can use them. All phones will be turned in (and off) at the beginning of rehearsals and picked up after dismissal. The expectation is for you to be here, focused, and engaged at rehearsal.
- If you are sick (ie: vomiting/fever/diarrhea/viruses) do NOT come to rehearsal. You should have stayed home from school and we don't want your germs. It will not count against you. You must call **me** (or text) that you have stayed home and are dying of illness. **DO NOT tell a friend to tell me**. Be responsible. Allergies do not count as being sick.
- 7) Emergencies happen. This I understand. What is an emergency you may ask? Death in the *family*, car accident, and the like. See below for things that are NOT emergencies.

#### These are NOT EMERGENCIES!

Running home to get clothes and or your script is not an emergency!

Getting stuck in traffic is NOT an emergency.

Forgetting there is construction is NOT an emergency.

Tickets to some other event on the day and time you have rehearsal is NOT an emergency.

Going to your siblings' games is NOT an emergency.

Birthdays (yours and family members) are NOT emergencies.

Going out to dinner is NOT an emergency

Remember you and YOUR PARENTS signed the audition form and that acts as a CONCTRACT between us. It is your agreement to adhere to the policy and all rehearsals.

We are entered into the St. Louis High School Musical Theatre Awards. If nominated, there are extra dates that students will be expected to attend rehearsals.

Music Rehearsals focus on music (some acting/character work)
Pit Rehearsals focus on rehearsing with the pit (including singing)
Acting/Blocking Rehearsals focus on blocking, acting (including singing)
Choreo Rehearsals focus on choreography with the choreographer (dance)

Rehearsal content subject to change based on needs of the show!

There are a few Saturday power rehearsals.

Plan on being at *every rehearsal* unless we tell you otherwise.

All rehearsals start with warm ups and small improv.

Please schedule any doctor/orthodontist/appointments on days where you do not have rehearsal. There are only 2 allowed absences (aside from listed conflicts.) If more than 2 are missed, you will be dismissed from the production.

This year there is an Activity Fee. This fee will cover the cost of your shirt, your costume, and some advertisement. **Cast Fee is \$100.** This includes your t-shirt and costume. If you are planning on attending the cast/crew party at the end of the show, \$5 will be needed to help pay party cost. Each member of the company is required to be at Strike which is listed on the rehearsal schedule. Each member of the company is required to assist in distributing posters to the local business for advertisement.

Actors are required to wear appropriate clothing that allows for movement. **No jeans!** Work out pants, athletic shorts, pajama pants are all ok. T-Shirts, sweat-shirts, and tank tops (no spaghetti straps) are ok. Remember no one wants to see your underwear! Proper shoes are required. No flip flops or open toe shoes. Warm ups are done shoe-less, so unless you want people to see your feet, wear socks. You are responsible for all your own makeup and undergarments for the show. You are responsible for purchasing your own tap shoes (for seagulls and Scuttle only), ballet and Jazz shoes.
